Question of the Month: What is the State Gem of Texas?



The question of the month for December was "What is the State Gem of Texas?" The official gemstone of Texas, as approved by the state legislature in 1969, is Texas Blue Topaz. Note that not just any blue topaz will qualify. It has to be Texas Blue Topaz. This gemstone is found in the Llano Uplift, primarily in the area west and northwest of Mason, TX. Perhaps the prime spot (according to Gem Trails of Texas) for Texas Blue Topaz is the Wayne Hoffman Ranch located northwest of Mason.

The Hoffman Ranch for years has allowed fee digging for this fine stone. Another area (also identified by Gem Trails of Texas) is along the Katemcy Creek north of Mason and south of the San Saba River. Most of the land there is private property. You need permission of the owner before you can search.

Again, I would like to stress that for the Blue Topaz to be an official state gemstone, it has to be found in Texas. There is a lot of Blue Topaz to be found on the open market, but most of it is treated by irradiation and/or heat. Many otherwise worthless clear topaz specimens can be irradiated to numerous shades of blue. This is a common and accepted practice in the gem trade industry. Naturally, Blue Topaz is quite rare. The Blue Topaz from Mason County is considered some of the best in the world.

The official state gemstone cut, as approved in 1977 is the Texas Lone Star cut. When you look straight down on the table of this faceted stone, the five pointed star is displayed. The faceting instruction for this cut can be found at the SHG website in the reference.


