

Christmas Mineral or Rock Revisited

The December 2018 Chips and Chatter featured an article titled "Tourmaline, a Mineral for Christmas." The Watermelon variety of tourmaline with its red and green needles on a white matrix had all the colors to remind me of Christmas – Green (Christmas Tree), Red (Santa's Suit), and White (Snow). As a rock for

Christmas, I nominated Blood Stone – a green variety of chalcedony that has red spots of hematite scattered throughout. Again it was the



colors, red and green, that led me to name it my Christmas Rock. In December 2019 I added the Calcite and Wilmanite specimens from Franklin

County, NJ to my list of Christmas Minerals. When illuminated with an ultraviolet light source (black light), it displays brilliant red and green areas (islands) on a black background. When illuminated by a normal light source, it often shows green and white areas.

I was thinking about a new Christmas Rock or Mineral and found a gold mine of ideas on Mindat, a general article (blog?) titled Minerals

Reminiscent of Christmas (https://www.mindat.org/mesg-278215.html). Due to copyright laws, I cannot show you the pictures from the article, but I would highly encourage you to follow the link and take a look for yourself. You will find a decorated Christmas Tree in a Silver specimen, a Stilbite bow tinged with Celadonite, a Christmas scene with a Christmas tree using rocks and minerals as ornaments, rocks and mineral gifts around the tree, and a fireplace with a glowing (red colored) rock fire. Next is a Mesolite specimen shaped like a snowman carrying a small gift of stilbite. You will also find a Gold and a Cerussite (?) Christmas wreaths, a blue Christmas tree, a mineral forest with a Christmas tree, a Christmas tree with Quartz Points decorations, and more – it just keeps going on. Again, I encourage you to follow the link and see for yourself.

As I was reading about the Gold and Cerussite wreaths, it suddenly dawned on me what the most obvious Christmas Mineral/Rock should be, and it is not a rock or a mineral, but it sure seems like one. It is COAL. What else more represents Christmas than a stocking stuffed with Coal that you always dreaded if you were a "bad" little boy or girl. So, it may represent Christmas, but it is the Christmas you don't want to have. There is nothing like a gentle reminder of coal in your stocking you hang up at the fireplace to remind you to be the perfect angel, at least during December!

ARE YOU A PHISHING TARGET

It has become common to hear of people who've fallen victim to one scheme or another. And no, it's not always older ones who trip up. Although it's easy to say, "I would never fall for that", those who use these schemes are very good at disguising them as legitimate, many times

pretending to be a company you have dealings with or even one of your acquaintances or friends.

Whether it's a text sent to your phone, an email that slips through your spam filter, or some other avenue, it's not always easy to tell if it's real or a phishing scheme. These scammers launch thousands of phishing attacks like these every day and are constantly updating their methods. And, they're often successful.

One of the most recent, many AFMS, SCFMS, and other club officers are receiving requests for members to buy gift cards or do some other favor involving money for another club member. It's believed the officers are targeted by a web crawler that harvests email addresses from federation and club-related websites, newsletters, and emails. It's strongly suggested to change the email address format of any posted on your club's website and in your club newsletter. Instead of the typical address, use the word "at" instead of the "@" symbol and use spaces. Remove hyperlinks for email addresses as these web crawler algorithms can follow the hyperlink.

Federations, gem clubs, and the officers of these will NOT request you to purchase gift cards or ask you to send them money to do them a favor. If you receive a money request, call the person the email seems to be from to double-check if it's a legitimate request. Never click on a link asking you to confirm your account or to send money online. These are most likely phishing scams aimed a robbing you of your hard-earned money or goods.

Please be aware that these schemes are out there, keep yourself and your loved ones safe.

Editor's Note: Watch out for what appear to be email addresses from friends, businesses, and even from people you do not know: It is easy for scammers to use a familiar email address when it is actually bogus. With most email systems, if you hover your mouse over the email address name, the full email address pops up letting you see if the address is legitimate. If the email is bogus, mark it as spam – do not open it.
