Question of the Month: What is the State Rock of Texas?

The question of the month for January is "What is the State Rock of Texas?" Actually, the state of Texas does not have a "state rock". However, Texas does have an official stone, approved by the state legislature in 1969, and it is Petrified Palmwood. Interestingly, Louisiana does have a state rock, and, wouldn't you know, it is also Petrified Palmwood (some sources list agate). But just to make sure we knew, Louisiana also designated Petrified Palmwood as their state Fossil! For the record, Louisiana didn't get around to designating its state fossil and stone until 1976.

The Texas state stone and gem were both made official by the state legislature in 1969. Do we have any idea

who requested that Petrified Palmwood and Blue Topaz be recognized? How often have you spent time just snooping around the joint workshop? Well, I was the shop supervisor on the 16th of December, and as I was cleaning up near closing time, I noticed a paper covered with Plexiglas in the classroom. There it was, a copy of the official state proclamation of Palmwood and Blue Topaz as the state stone and gem, and it was based on a recommendation of the Dallas Gem and Mineral Society. We can thank our sister club for our state's official stone and gem! Way to go, DGMS!

The petrified palmwood found today originated as palm trees of the genus *Palmoxylon* (now extinct) which grew along the ocean shoreline. Fossils of sponges, corals, and mollusks are often found in the same vicinity. The ocean shoreline has moved further south over the millions of years. Palmwood is generally cut perpendicular to the tube-like structures prevalent in the stone. These structures are sclerenchyma bundles which moved water and nutrients to and from the roots and the leaves of the living trees. When cut perpendicular, the tubes look like dots. However, palmwood can be cut at any angle relative to the tubes; if cut parallel, the tubes look like lines.
