**Program**: Don Shurtz introduced Taylor and informed us of her program topic. Taylor is the young lady Pleasant Oaks Gem and Minerals selected as our First Place winner in the Science Fair Project. Our team of judges decided her project was the best geological project they have observed in a long time. Her project title was The Eruptions of the Valles Caldera; Formation of the Bandelier Tuff.

There are 4 layers of tuff. Every time the volcano erupted there was a bedding plane formed between the two layers of tuff, or a change in color or texture, which indicates how many times the volcano has erupted. The bottom layer is 60 feet, it's the 1<sup>st</sup> layer. The 2<sup>nd</sup> layer is 62 feet, the 3<sup>rd</sup> layer was the softest layer and the 4<sup>th</sup> layer is 44 feet. The layers are made up of pumice and balsalt.

This caldera is close to Los Alamos, New Mexico in the Jemez Mountains. Taylor had some very nice photos of the caldera showing the color changes in the layers, and of the surrounding countryside.

We had our raffle and adjourned at 8:40pm.
